Who qualifies to receive the flu shot?

- 1. Children 6 months through 18 years of age
- 2. Adults with *no ability to pay** who are at increased risk for severe complications from the flu. These include:
 - a. Chronic pulmonary (lung) disorders, including asthma and individuals with compromised respiratory function
 - b. Cardiovascular (heart) problems;
 - c. Chronic metabolic disorders (such as diabetes);
 - d. HIV/AIDS;
 - e. Long-term aspirin therapy;
 - f. Pregnant women.
- 3. Adults with *no ability to pay** who are 50 years of age and older
- 4. Adults with *no ability to pay** who are healthy household contacts and caregivers of children 0-59 months of age

*All adults with other means to pay for vaccination (such as those with Buckeye, CareSource, Medicaid, Medicare, Molina, Paramount, United Healthcare Community Plan, or any private insurance) are encouraged to get vaccinated at their primary care physician's office, a local pharmacy, or other agencies providing flu vaccinations.

We appreciate you adhering to the qualifications listed above.

Adults and children that qualify can receive vaccination by **scheduling an appointment** during our regularly scheduled clinics times as follows:

Monday 8:20 - 11:20 am and 1:20 - 3:20 pm 2nd Thursday of every month 4:00 pm - 6:40 pm
