Dental sealant for 2nd and 6th grade children in qualifying schools in Stark and Carroll Counties

Disease Intervention Services

Targeted follow-up and treatment for HIV and syphilis

Early Intervention Services

Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP), navigation access to prevent HIV

Home Birth Follow-up

Nurse visit to provide preventative care

Immunizations

Childhood immunizations, travel vaccines, flu Vaccines, COVID vaccines, education, community resource

Sexually Transmitted Infection (STI) Testing, Treatment, and Prevention

Sexual Health Clinic, STI/HIV testing, STI education, condom distribution

- Children must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian; guardianship paperwork must be provided
