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What is Ohio PREP?

Personal Responsibility Education Program (PREP) for Foster Care and Adjudicated Youth

Ohio PREP is a grant program funded by the US Department of Health and Human Services, as a result of the Affordable Care Act of 2010. The Ohio Department of Health (ODH) posted requests for proposals for nine (9) separate regions in the state.

The program will focus efforts on educating direct-care staff of foster care and adjudicated youth (14 – 19 years) to provide evidence-based curriculum on BOTH abstinence and contraception to prevent pregnancy and sexually transmitted infections (STI) including HIV/AIDS. These educational programs for youth will be community based not school based.

GOALS OF Ohio PREP:

- Reduce the rates of teen pregnancy and STI including HIV/ AIDS
- Increase the number of youth in the target populations who successfully transition to adulthood
- Increase and enhance workforce development of child welfare and juvenile justice professionals by providing consistent, standardized in service training on evidence based teen pregnancy prevention curriculum and adulthood topics
- Develop a coalition of representatives of agencies/organizations and key stakeholders, from all nine (9) counties, who work with and are familiar with the target population.

The Canton City Health Department, in partnership with Kent State University, has been awarded funding for Region six (6) by the Ohio Department of Health. Region six (6) covers the following nine (9) counties: Carroll, Columbiana, Holmes, Mahoning, Portage, Stark, Trumbull, Tuscarawas, and Wayne.

Teen Pregnancy and STD/HIV Prevention

Ohio Department of Health is working with PREP (Personal Responsibility Education Program) grantees in your region to roll out evidence based training and curriculum classes, *Reducing the Risk*, for both direct care staff and teens aged 14-19 in DJFS and DYS custody. This will be a great opportunity to involve your youth in dialogue about waiting to start a family. Research shows foster youth are 2.5 times more likely to get pregnant while in care, and MUCH more likely to have an unintended pregnancy and/or get an STD before age 21, upon emancipating from your care.

Throughout our work on this effort, Region 6 has worked to engage various agencies and partners, to help them understand their role in teen pregnancy prevention among this population. In addition to professionals within the child welfare system, it is also the responsibility of foster parents, care providers, educators, and professionals within juvenile and family courts to support the youth in foster care make healthy, informed decisions.

Upcoming PREP Activities

- ◆ 12/7/12 PREP Train- the Trainer at Goodwill Industries Inc in Stark County
- Release of the Ohio PREP Region 6 website
- Goal: Train 20% of direct care staff and 10% youth in the modified RTR program during year two of funding
- Discussion on provider relations and the need to "get the word out" through site visits
- Co-facilitation and implementation of a modified RTR program with youth

- Awarded ODH grant funding 2012/2013
- PREP Train-the-Trainer training at the Northeast Ohio Regional Training Center was held 10/10/12
- Co-facilitation of first PREP sessions with youth at Portage DJFS, Multi-County Juvenile Attention System, and Indian River DYS agencies.
